

3. For Israel's witness *it* **is** * to praise the name of *the* **LORD**.


There were set the thrones *for* **judg**ment, * the thrones of the house *of* **David**.

Ps 135 (134): 3, 6




Psalm 135 (134)


Psalm 13 (12)

There were set the *thrones for* **judg**ment, * the thrones of the house *of* **David**.


For the peace of Jerusalem pray, *

Psalm 27 (26)


1. The LORD is my light and *my salva*tion; * whom *shall I* **fear**?
