Behind and before, *you be*siege me, \* your hand ever laid *u***pon** me.


Too wonderful for *me, this* knowledge; \* too high, beyond *my* reach.

 Then go quickly and tell *his disc*iples, \* "He has been raised *from the* dead,


and he is going before *you to* Galilee; \* there *you will* see him."
