

Into your hands I com*mend my* **spir**it. \* You will redeem me, O LORD, O faith*ful* **God**.


You detest those who serve *empty* idols. \*

You have laid down *your* **pre**cepts \* to be carefully **kept**.


3. May my ways *be* **firm** \* in keeping *your* **stat**utes.
