

 Mount Sion, in the heart of the North, * the city of the Mighty King!


God, in the midst *of its* **cit**adels, * has shown himself *its* **strong**hold.

Before him all kings *shall fall* **prost**rate, * all nations shall **serve** him.


 For he shall save the needy *when they* cry, * the poor, and those who are helpless.




Psalm 45 (44)
