## FOREWORD

This collection provides simplified versions of the Major Propers of the Mass (Gradual, Alleluia, and Tract) for Sundays, in addition to other Masses most likely to be sung during the course of the Church Year. It follows the traditional arrangement for the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite (1962 Roman Missal). I developed this approach over several years directing a schola of able, but amateur singers, who (along with their director) generally lacked the virtuosity needed to sing the more elaborate authentic Gregorian melodies of the Gradual and Alleluia verses on a regular basis. In some cases, it was time constraints, rather than the melodies themselves, that posed difficulties, especially for the longer chants (such as the Tracts for the First Sunday of Lent and Palm Sunday, where the authentic chants run to several pages in the *Liber usualis*).

I have replaced the melodies of the Gradual and Alleluia verses with the corresponding Psalm tone for the Introit of the Mass. (Other collections use the simple tones of the Divine Office, but this seems a better solution in the context of Mass.) But because the endings of these tones seem overly curt and frequently sound incomplete, I have retained the authentic melody for the ends of verses, with the return of the full choir marked with an asterisk, as in the *Liber* (assuming the verse is sung by a cantor or two, which is certainly not required). I have tried to find the most graceful point of return, and to use Psalm tone endings, when possible, that provide the smoothest transition back to the authentic melody. This retains the *jubilus*, so often featured at the ends of these verses, and so characteristic of the various modal melodies. (For many Alleluia chants, the *jubilus* repeats the music of the Alleluia itself.) For the Tracts, I have provided the authentic chant for the first verse, but also provide the simplified version at the end of the chant. The authentic melody completes the final verse, again with an asterisk to mark the return of the full group (assuming an antiphonal rendering between two halves of the schola). In addition, I have included simplified versions of a few Responsories used during processions for certain Masses.

For some shorter verses, such as those for the double Alleluia chants during the Easter season, a simplified version may seem unnecessary and too abrupt, in which case I encourage scholas to budget rehearsal time to master the authentic melodies.

I have included a guide (*custos*) at the end of the Gradual or first Alleluia to suggest my idea of the tonal relationship with the chant that follows. (To clarify, the *custos* following the first chant gives the relative pitch for the first note of the next chant.) Other directors are free to find their own solution to the problem.

My hope is that other scholas can benefit from my experience, and that this approach can alleviate some of the stress associated with chanting Mass in the Extraordinary Form. At the same time, I hope I have preserved enough of the authentic melodies to maintain a sense of musical integrity for these chants, in a way that provides a good next step toward the full and integral chanting of *Missa cantata*.
