PREFACE

This collection of hymns is intended as a supplement to *Music First and Second Years* of the *Catholic Education Series*.

It is not, however, meant for the use of children in the First and Second Grades, although technically the music is within their capacity. The needs of these children are amply met by the songs contained in the Readers.

The present volume is intended for the use of older children who are beginning the study of music and who are using the exercises in sight reading contained in the First and Second Year charts. For the latter, songs were required which would be more mature in content than those provided by the Readers. The Hymnal was therefore compiled for this purpose, and with a view to encouraging the children to utilize their musical knowledge immediately in the services of the Church.

The collection includes many of the great liturgical hymns of the Church in Latin and with English renderings, set, for the most part, to Gregorian melodies. It also contains one complete Common of the Mass (the Gregorian *Missa de Angelis*), the *Responses at Mass*, the *Asperges*, the *Vidi Aquam*, and the psalms at the Introit. The various psalm tones are also ingeniously introduced by the Rev. J. B. Young, S.J., in his setting of the prayers of the Baltimore Catechism to Gregorian melodies which are included in this volume.

The hymns are marked with a single or a double asterisk according to their difficulty; the former being within the capacity of First Year students, the latter requiring a knowledge of *Music Second Year*. One hymn only requires a knowledge of *Music Third Year*, and this is marked with a triple asterisk.

It will be noticed that where several notes are sung to a single syllable these notes are joined by a tie-mark below the numbers. This tie does not affect the time value of the notes. It is merely a guide for the eye in determining the relation between the notes and the syllables.

It is hoped that this Hymnal may contribute its quota toward "restoring the use of Gregorian Chant by the people" and encourage them to "take an active part in the ecclesiastical services of the Church" according to the desire of the Holy See, "by joining in the Common or simpler parts of the Mass, and in the liturgical hymns of the Church, as well as hymns in the vernacular." We believe that an effective step in that direction will have been taken when we place these hymns, as well as the music of the Mass, before Catholic children in a form which they will be able to read easily and can render effectively.
