Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The belief that Our Lady did not remain in the grave but was bodily received into heaven is very ancient, and since the Middle Ages many churches have been dedicated to this mystery. However, only in 1950 did Pope Pius XII define that the bodily Assumption of Our Lady as a binding part of the Catholic Faith. At this occasion new Propers for this day were introduced.

INTROIT: Rev. 12:1

Signum magnum apparuit in cælo : mulier amicta sole, et luna sub pedibus ejus, et in capite ejus corona stellarum duodecim. *Ps. 97:1-2:* Cantate Domino canticum novum : quia mirabilia fecit. V. Gloria.

A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. Ps. 97:1-2: Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle: for he hath done wonderful things. V. Glory.

A lesson from the Book of Judith.

The Lord hath blessed thee by his power, because by thee he hath brought our enemies to nought. Blessed art thou, O daughter, by the Lord, the most high God, above all women on the earth. Blessed be the Lord who made heaven and earth, who hath directed thee to the cutting off the head of the prince of our enemies. High Gabriel announceth the new joys, the birth of the eternal king on earth, and he greateth the mother thus:

(Thrice) Hail Mary, kind mother of my Lord, full of heavenly grace.

Thou, blessed one, shalt give birth to him who is king forever, and be made queen of the earth.

She said, how can I become fertile since I know no man since I have been born, and always remained a chaste Virgin.

Be not afraid, replied the Angel: The Holy Ghost shall descend upon thee, O chaste, and made fertile by him thou shalt give birth to God and man together.

O truly holy and loveable lady, from whom our redemption was born, the salvation of the world and true life.

O pious Mother of God: receive our prayer on this day, on which thou art received to the gates of heaven.
