Psalm 125

Sow in tears, reap in joy

This psalm presents two splendid pictures: 1) Christ, the Sower on earth, in tears and sweat, sowing the seed by work, prayer and suffering; 2) the joyful harvest in heaven; with sheaves heavy in merit, Christ comes to the heavenly harvest.

Accordingly, the psalm has two strophes: 1) Thanksgiving for salvation through Jesus (grace); 2) petition for final salvation in heaven (glory). The hymn pictures both the life of a Christian as an individual and the Church as pastor of souls.

It is one of the most moving psalms in the Psalter.

Companions with him in suffering, you will share his overflowing happiness (2 Corinthians 1:7).

Our bonds are broken

Cantor: When the Lord delivered Sion from bondage, *

it seemed like a dream.

All: Then was our mouth filled with laughter, *

on our lips there were songs.

Cantor: The heathens themselves said: "What marvels *

the Lord worked *for* them!"

Psalm 126

God's blessing crowns the work

This psalm consists of two independent songs. The first one is a warning against too much activity and too little trust in God. The second pictures good children as a mighty blessing.

The Christian and the priest, as he prays, is warned never to ascribe success to his own doing; without God all his labor in God's harvest is in vain. The blessing of children also has a spiritual sense: they are the souls won over to God, and personal merits: both will be powerful champions for us on the day of judgment.

You are God's building (I Corinthians 3:9).

All human struggle is in vain

Cantor: If the Lord does not build the house, *

in vain do its build*ers* labor;

All: if the Lord does not watch over the city, *

in vain does the watchman keep vigil.

Cantor: In vain is your earlier rising, *

your going later to **rest**,

All: you who toil for the bread you eat: *

when he pours gifts on his beloved while *they* **slum**ber,

Unless God's blessing comes to our aid

Cantor: Truly sons are a gift from the Lord, *

a blessing, the fruit of the womb.

All: Indeed the sons of **youth** *

are like arrows in the hand of a warrior.

Cantor: O the happiness of the man *

who has filled his quiver with these arrows!

All: He will have no cause for **shame** *

when he disputes with his foes in the gateways.
