

CHRIST THE KING. AT FIRST VESPERS

King of kings, and crown of all the Saints

The Feast of Christ the King is celebrated at the end of the liturgical year as the commemoration of all the mysteries by which Jesus has established his royal powers, he who is the "King of kings, and crown of all the Saints" — until he shall be the crown of all those on earth whom he saves, especially by the Mass. It is indeed principally by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass which is both a sacrifice and a sacrament, that Christ, now in glory, assures the results of the victorious sacrifice of Calvary, by taking possession of souls through the application of the merits of his Passion and thereby unites them as members to their Head. The end of the Eucharist is "to form one sole mystic body of all the faithful" and so to draw them in the cult which Christ, king-adorer, as Priest and Victim, rendered in a bloody manner on the Cross and now renders in an unbloody manner, on the stone altar of our churches and on the golden altar in heaven, to Christ, king-adored, as Son of God, and to his Father to whom he offers these souls.
